Short Line Fatality on No. 41 Track

In a discussion today with Eli Pupovac, Maintenance Foreman, about the deceased, Michael Matuzcak, he related some past observations that may give better understanding of the fatal accident.

Eli stated that Matuzcak had a severe arthritic condition. He shuffled his feet to walk and his movement was slow. He had kidded the deceased about the truck he drove moved just like he walked. He had observed Matuzcak connecting brake air hoses. He apparently had trouble hooking the hoses due to his arthritis. He would support himself with a car grab iron and squat down on one leg while sticking the other leg over the rail in a stiff, straight-out position. He would sit on the rail in this position and couple the hoses.

Rail worker run over by coal car, killed

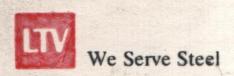
A 64-year-old freight car inspector for the Chicago Short Line Railway Co. was killed yesterday when he was run over by an empty coal car at the Interlake Inc. coke pit yards, 11236 S. Torrence Av.

Investigator James Kenney of the Burnside Homicide Unit said Michael Matuszak, who lived at 8907 S. Houston Av., was found by co-workers lying on the tracks with his right leg severed.

The railroad workmen said Matuszak was inspecting empty coal cars coming down a hill after their contents had been emptied. The workers told police that Matuszak apparently was coupling two empty cars when a third car came down the hill, bumped the other two, and knocked Matuszak onto the tracks.

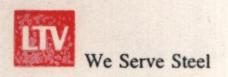

Dear Dick:

This will confirm our telephone conversations of September 23, 1992 and this morning wherein we discussed the detention rule and detention charges which would be applicable on Sommerset coal originating in the state of Colorado which will be unloaded at your facility in the coming months. Since neither your company, as the consignee, nor our company, as the terminating switch line, will be parties to this contract, and since we have agreed that the normal coal detention free time of 24 hours per car would not be applicable on these particular shipments of coal, we have agreed to the following detention rule and detention charge which will apply on the unloading of the Sommerset coal at your 112th Street facility.

DETENTION AT DESTINATION

Except as otherwise provided, seventy-two (72) hours, including Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays (see Note), will be allowed at destination for unloading cars included in a consignment, time to be computed from the first 7:00 A.M. after actual or constructive placement of such cars on consignee's unloading track or in consignee's storage yard to the tender of each empty car to the Carrier. A detention charge of twenty dollars (\$20.00) per car will be assessed against the consignee for each day (24 hours) or fraction thereof that cars are held in excess of seventy-two (72) hours, as computed under the provisions of this paragraph until such cars are unloaded and released to the Carrier.

EXCEPTIONS

1. When, at the time of actual or constructive placement on consignee's unloading track, lading is frozen so as to require heating, thawing or loosening to unload, the unloading time shall be extended an additional twenty-four (24) hours provided the consignee shall, prior to the expiration of ten (10) days after the date on which the car or cars were released, send or give the Railway's Agent a written statement certifying by car initial and number, the day during which any time was expended in heating, thawing or loosening the lading to unload the car or cars. If written statement is mailed, the date of notice will be determined by the postmark.

- 2. If as a direct result of any of the following events, consignee is unable to unload cars of a consignment, no detention charges will be assessed during the duration of the event:
 - (a) damage to the car, unless caused by the consignee.

The consignee must certify in writing to the Carrier, within ten (10) days of the date the event occurred, the nature of the event and the time and date it began or ended. In applying this notice requirement, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays (see Note) shall not be counted.

Note: The term "Holiday" referred to above embraces only the following:

New Year's Day Washington's Birthday Good Friday Memorial Day

Independence Day Labor Day Thanksgiving Day Christmas Day

In the event one of the above Holidays occurs on Sunday, the following Monday will be considered as a Holiday.

If you are agreeable to the application of this detention rule and charge, please have the appropriate party sign this letter for the account of Acme Steel Company and it will constitute a separate agreement between our respective companies on these coal shipments. Thank you very much for your cooperation in this matter.
